SQLBase for Windows Installation

The SQLBase for Windows upgrade includes the following;

C/API
WinTalk
SQL language manual
C/API manual
Database Administrator manual

Wintalk is another database access tool which uses SQL command lines. With the SQL language manual you may use this tool, or the SQL button in Quest, to write SQL commands or SQL script files to make changes in the database. See the instructions below for installing the SQL button in Quest.

SQLBase installation

- 1) If you have not already done so install the Quest program first
- 2) Install the SQLBase upgrade products
- 3) Delete the file SQLAPIW.DLL in the X:\lcta\prgms directory (where X is the drive letter)
- 4) Click once on the DBWindows icon in the Quest group
Pick FILE from the Program Manager menu
Pick PROPERTIES
In the Description field enter DBWServr
In the Command Line field replace DBWINDOW.EXE with DBWSERVER.EXE
- 5) Add the WinTalk icon to the Quest group
Click once on any icon in the Quest group
Pick FILE from the Program Manager menu
Pick New
Pick Program Item
In the Description field enter WinTalk
In the Command Line field enter X:\GUPTA\WINTALK.EXE (where X is the drive letter)
In the Working Directory field enter X:\GUPTA
- 6) Using the Windows NotePad program open the file X:\GUPTA\SQL.INI
Pick Search from the Notepad menu
Pick Find
Enter winclient.dll
Click on Find Next
In this section confirm the line comdll=sqlwsv does not have a semicolon (;) preceding the line
All other lines in this section beginning with comdll should have a semicolon preceding the line
Save the file
- 7) Reboot the machine

Installing the SQL button in Quest

- 1) Using the Windows Notepad program open the file X:\GUPTA\QUEST.INI
- 2) Add the line ACTIVITY5=SQL.DLL below the ACTIVITY4 line
- 3) Save the file
